

Certified copy of a Report of the Committee of the Privy Council, approved by His Excellency the Governor General on the 4th April 1921.

The Committee of the Privy Council have had before them a report, dated 24th March, 1921, from the Minister of Militia and Defence, stating that the Department of the Interior has applied for the transfer of the following Military properties which are considered to be of a National historic importance, in order that they may undertake the work of restoration and future maintenance,-

Monument Site	Chateauguay Monument	Allan's Corner, Chateauguay County Province of Quebec.	0.25 "	Erected by Canadian Government in 1895, to commemorate victory over Americans at Battle of Chateauguay 26th Oct. 1813.

The Minister recommends, as these properties are used solely as monument sites, as designated above, and are not required for military purposes, that they be transferred to the control of the Department of the Interior, for restoration and maintenance.

The Committee submit the same for approval.
