The monument at Chrysler's
Farm has always interested me in many ways.

My Grandfather had often told
me about his uncle, a son of Col. John Nairne, First
seigneur of Murray Bay, had been killed at the battle
of Chrysler's Farm. Not until this summer had I
the occasion to stop at the monument, although I was
born only fifteen miles away at the "Old Homestead",
Iroquois. I was quite interested to see that a
bronze monument had been added to the monument but
may I draw your attention to the inscription on same.
It reads:- Captain John Nairne, but should read
Captain Thomas Nairn. John Nairn was also a son
of Col. John Nairn, but he was killed in India in
1799, serving in the Imperial Army.

Perhaps at some future date
the tablet may need touching up and the correction
made then.
