General Bruikshank was communicated with in regard to the spelling of the word "Chrysler", and has replied stating there can be no doubt that Captain John Chrysler, the owner or tenant of the farm that gave its name to the battle fought there, spelled his name "Crysler".

As the name is spelled "Chrysler" on the tablet erected, the General considers it inadvisable to make any alterations, and that while he concurs in the proposal to retain the form "Chrysler" in the proposed pamphlet, to correspond with the tablet, he suggests that a footnote should be added stating that "Crysler" is the proper form of the name as written by Captain Crysler himself.
