Dear Mr. Cote:

Thanking you for your letter of April 23, in which you were kind enough to quote the notes which your Mr. Hutchison had made at the time of the meeting which the late Mr. James Smart and Dr. Carroll of this Commission held with you on October 28th, 1955.

Items A, B and C, as proposed by Dr. Carroll at that time are being carried out.

The actual moving of the Chrysler's Farm Monument from the present site is the responsibility of Ontario Hydro, but this Commission has constructed the mound on which it will be placed as the centrepiece or focal point of the Chrysler's Farm Battle Memorial Park.

The Mall leading up to the mound will be developed in the near future, and will make an attractive approach to the Monument, which will be quite conspicuous from both the river and the new highway. One change that has been made in the original planning is that the military museum building will be located on the landward side of the mound instead of the river side as shown in the model.

In response to your request, we are pleased to send you under separate cover a plan showing the location of the Memorial Mound and Monument in relation to the Upper Canada Village and other features of the Chrysler's Park.

Again thanking you for your assistance, and hoping you will have an opportunity in the near future to see what is being done in the Park.
